


The Poppy Lady-Monia Belle Michael and Her Tribute to Veterans Author: Barbara Elizabeth Walsh

- 1. What was Monia Belle Michael's nickname? The Poppy Lady
- 2. Where was Monia born? Georgia
- 3. How old was Monia when she volunteered to teach children in her community?
- 4. How would you describe Monia? What character traits did she have? Answers will vary, but should include some of the following: Kind, Giving, Determined, Strong Work Ethic, Good Character, Volunteer Spirit, etc.
- 5. What obstacles did Moina have to overcome to accomplish her dream of helping veterans?
- A. Moina wanted to go overseas to volunteer as a canteen worker, she was told she was too old to go overseas to volunteer.
- B. Moina decided to volunteer in the basement of a Columbia University Building in New York City. The work area was dark and dreary looking so Moina purchased flowers with her own money to brighten up the space. She met with the troops when they came in and tried to be like a mother or sister to the troops. Helping them if they needed it, or just talking to them about home.
- C. After seeing the article with the picture of the red poppies and John McCrae's poem "In Flanders Fields" in the magazine, she wanted the country to adopt the Red Poppy as a symbol of Remembrance. She had to write many letters, and travel to many places, using her own money, to finally get support from the American Legion to accept the Red Poppy as the national symbol of Remembrance.
- 6. What accomplishments did Moina have in her lifetime? Moina was able to fulfill her dream of serving veterans and of having the Red Poppy become the national symbol of Remembrance. She was able to raise a lot of money to help veterans and their families. Moina received many awards and commendations for her volunteer efforts on behalf of our veterans.


