Message from Executive Director, Karen Worcester

What is Wreaths Across America?



- A national nonprofit founded in 2007 to expand the annual wreath-laying ceremony held at Arlington National Cemetery, started by Morrill Worcester in 1992.
- The program's yearlong mission is to Remember the fallen,
 Honor those who serve, and Teach the next generation the value of freedom.
- Your \$17 sponsorship not only honors an American hero with the placement of a veteran's wreath in December but also supports the year-round program nationwide.
- The program has grown to include more than 3 million volunteers, a third of whom are children, and ceremonies are now held in every U.S. state and territory.

2023 Theme: Serve and Succeed

The inspiration for 2023's theme came while discussing the significance of 2022's theme, "Find a Way to Serve," and the need to continue to stress the importance of service and the positive ways it can impact lives. Wreaths Across America focused on the storylines of veterans and military families who have found success through their own service while highlighting local volunteers across the country and the success that comes from serving their communities. Throughout 2023, the organization continued its commitment to supporting and bringing attention to our veteran community's needs while showcasing the continued contributions of those who serve.

"There are many ways to serve your community and country, and just as many definitions of success," said Karen Worcester, executive director. "We hope through focusing on those stories of success, we will help change the dialogue around what it means to serve your country."



Remember the Fallen...

THE REMEMBRANCE TREE PROGRAM

The Remembrance Tree Program provides a living memorial to loved ones lost. Wreaths Across America established this *free* program as another way to remember and honor our veterans.

Over the last year, **975** new replica dog tags were placed in memory of loved ones who served, with more than **18**,000 tags now hanging throughout the Balsam Valley tip lands!



GOLD STAR FAMILY HISTORY & HOSPITALITY HOUSE

Wreaths Across America hosted 14 Gold Star Families in 2023 from more than eight states in the renovated bed and breakfast. In March, a special gathering of Vietnam Veterans was held at the house in the COL Roger Donlon Vietnam Veteran Parlor. The group spoke about their own service and how their lives have been shaped by it. The discussion was recorded and shared in a "Serve + Succeed" series on Wreaths America Radio.



2023 ESCORT TO ARLINGTON

The annual escort to Arlington National Cemetery kicked off on Saturday, Dec. 9, 2023. Stops with public events were held in Maine, New Hampshire, Connecticut, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, and Washington D.C., before arriving at Arlington National Cemetery on the morning of Saturday, Dec. 16 – National Wreaths Across America Day.







For the 9th year, Chevrolet generously provided the wrapped escort vehicles. Participants included Gold Star and Families Blue Star Families, volunteers, and veterans representing many eras and local Veteran Service Organizations such as the VFW, American Legion VFW Auxiliary, and the American Legion Auxiliary. Members of the Patriot Guard Riders, Patriot Riders and law enforcement from departments across Maine and other states along the route provided escort to ensure safe transport for all participants throughout the week.

- WAA conducts several programs to honor our veterans, including our popular Thanks-A-Million campaign, which distributes free "I Owe You" cards to people nationwide.
- The organization participates in veterans' events throughout the year, including many broadcasted LIVE with Wreaths Across America Radio.
- Through our Group Sponsorship program, WAA has helped other nonprofits, such as the Civil Air Patrol, local VFWs and American Legions, raise funds for their community and program needs. In 2023, \$3.3 million was given back to these organizations!

- WAA is a commemorative partner of The United States of America Vietnam War Commemoration. Through this partnership, WAA Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans at the National Museum and Mobile Education Exhibit events nationwide.


SPONSORSHIP GROUPS




Teach the next generation

New TEACH Program

Keeping with the 2023 theme, "Serve and Succeed," and the organization's commitment to teach the next generation the value of freedom through stories of courage and character, we were proud to see huge growth in our TEACH program.





This program has become wildly popular with professional educators and homeschoolers, with more than 11,412 downloads in 2023 on Teachers Pay Teachers. The most downloads were for American Indian Heritage Month, Patriots' Day, and Veterans Day. In 2023, we also launched the new quarterly newsletter, "Teaching Times." Currently, more than 14,000 active subscribers are receiving this content.

Lesson plans are FREE to download from www.wreathsacrossamerica.org/teach and are also available to all educators and homeschoolers on Teachers Pay Teachers. The program curriculum encompasses all grades from kindergarten through the senior year of high school.

MOBILE EDUCATION EXHIBIT (MEE)





In 2023, the MEE attended 168 events in 24 states and hosted over 17,697 visitors during these events; 2,327 Vietnam Veterans were pinned and Welcomed Home! This unique museum on wheels brings the WAA mission to YOUR community while teaching about the personal stories of those who serve/have served within that community. The MEE stops at local schools, offering learning tools, interactive-media projects and opportunities to participate in our efforts and shares stories of veteran courage and sacrifice.

In 2023, Wreaths Radio formed a broadcast partnership with Lonestar Community Radio in Conroe, Texas which carries a special episode of executive director Karen Worcester's show "Mission Matters" every month. This pilot program has the potential to allow Wreaths Across America Radio to provide content to other stations across the country.

In addition, we have enhanced our "Youth Correspondent" feature by having one of our correspondents, Cadence Smeltzer, interview folks on the Escort to Arlington and provide updates throughout the week.

Wreaths Radio will also continue outreach to military recruiters, highlighting their stories of service and the roles in the military that people may not think of when considering the opportunities.



MOU Partnerships

In 2023, Wreaths Across America was proud to partner with the American Legion Auxiliary (ALA), the Patriot Guard Riders and the Military Women's Memorial Foundation by signing three Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) agreements. Together, the goal is to build a stronger awareness of each group's common missions while supporting fundraising efforts nationwide.



ALA is a community of volunteers serving veterans, military, and their families. Their members also support the mission of The American Legion to improve the quality of life for our nation's veterans. Founded in 1919, the ALA is one of the oldest patriotic membership organizations in the United States. The ALA has been essential in increasing veterans' welfare and rehabilitation nationwide, including participation in the annual National Wreaths Across America Day events.



Founded as a national nonprofit in 2005 to shield families of fallen heroes from those who would disrupt the services of their loved ones, the **Patriot Guard Riders** has grown to include thousands of members across all 50 states.

As the organization's membership has grown, so has the scope of its mission. Patriot Guard Riders also honor first responders as well as military veterans. Additionally, the organization has an active Help on The Homefront (HOTH) program, which aids our veterans and their families.

In speaking about the partnership, retired Army Chief Warrant Officer 5 Phyllis Wilson, president of the **Military Women's Memorial Foundation**, said, "... joining forces in support of our common goal—to honor and tell the stories of America's military—is a force multiplier. We're excited to move forward with the Wreaths Across America team on a variety of initiatives that spotlight the extraordinary service of America's military."



"I feel strongly these partnerships will positively impact so many communities across the country," said Karen Worcester, executive director of WAA. "The work of each of these organizations is so important, and to know that we can assist them in their efforts to raise awareness for their mission and necessary funding to continue to support veterans and military families across the country is quite humbling."






