MATERIALS:	Computer/laptop; internet (with access to YouTube); Smart Board; copy of Check for Understanding- <i>Honesty is the New Cool</i> ; Be Cool-Be Honest Writing Practice; copies of the Eiffel Tower Drawing-Coloring Activity; copies of the Promise to be Honest Activity
Engage: Hook the students	Think/Pair/Share Activity- Pair the students with a partner. Explain the T/P/S directions. The students will think of their answer, get with their partner, and share their answer. T/P/S Question: Why is it important to always tell the truth? Explain: Being honest means we are truthful in what we say and do. It means people can depend on us because we have integrity. Honesty is the basis of a trusting relationship. Integrity is defined as being strong enough to do what you know is right. Integrity is also knowing the difference between right and wrong and choosing to do the right thing, even when it is difficult.
Explore: Students make sense of a concept through observations.	Play YouTube Read aloud, <i>Honesty is the New Cool</i> , Author-Jacqueline Crann, Illustrator-Abira Das. https://youtu.be/EyRwKStlxPE Read aloud the Check for Understanding-Honesty is the New Cool questions. Allow the students time to answer the questions. Hand out the Be Cool-Be Honest Writing Practice Worksheet. Allow students time to complete the assignment. Hand out the Eiffel Tower Drawing-Coloring Activity. Allow the students time to complete the assignment. Hand out the Promise to Be Honest Activity. Allow the students time to complete the activity.
Explain: Teacher introduces formal vocabulary and language to students.	honesty Paris, France integrity Eiffel Tower England trust

Check for Understanding-*Honesty is the New Cool*

1. Myles was a very likable boy, he was kind to his family and friends, but Myles had one small problem. What was Myles' problem? **Myles sometimes told lies, things that were not true.**
2. At summer camp, Miss Lisa asks the children what they did over the weekend. What did Myles and his family do over the weekend? **Myles and his family went to the library and picked out books.**
3. What did Myles tell Miss Lisa and the other children that his family did over the weekend? **Myles told them that he and his family had gone to Paris over the weekend and that he had seen the Eiffel Tower.**
4. Why was Miss Lisa confused when Myles said what he had done over the weekend? **Miss Lisa was confused because Myles told her he was going to the Library on Saturday.**
5. Why do you think Myles lied about what his family had done over the weekend? **Answers will vary but should include that Myles liked the attention he got when he said he had gone to Paris and seen the Eiffel Tower.**
6. How did Myles respond when the other children asked him questions about his trip to Paris? **Myles continued to tell lies about the trip, and he was quite pleased with himself.**
7. Who finally told the truth about where Myles was on Saturday? **Ivy told Miss Lisa and the kids at the camp that she had seen Myles at the library with his family on Saturday.**
8. How did Myles feel when he was caught in a lie? **Myles was afraid and embarrassed. He could not say anything. He put his head down on the table.**
9. Why do you think Miss Lisa changed the subject when she realized Myles had not been telling the truth? **Answers will vary.**
10. Myles was quiet when his Mommy picked him up from school, why do you think he was so quiet? **Answers will vary.**

11. What reason did Myles give his Mommy for not telling the truth at camp? **Myles told his Mommy that he just wanted the kids at camp to like him and think he was cool.**

12. What did Mommy tell Myles he needed to do? **Mommy told Myles he needed to go to camp the next day and offer a sincere apology to Miss Lisa and the children.**

13. How did Myles feel the next morning on the way to camp? **Myles was sad, his heart was beating fast and he was nervous-we know that because the author says Myles has butterflies in his belly.**

14. Myles was surprised when he got to camp. Why was he surprised? **Because his friends did not act like they did not like him.**

15. What happened after Myles apologized to Miss Lisa and his friends? **His friends clapped and cheered and told him "Thank You" for being honest.**

16. What did Myles tell his Mommy? **Myles told his Mommy "Honesty is the new cool."**

17. Do you think Myles learned his lesson about not telling the truth? Why or why not? **Answers will vary.**
