

Engage: Hook the students	Explain: The words humility and selflessness mean thinking of others before yourself. A humble person doesn't think less of himself; he simply thinks of himself less and puts others first. Modesty is the quality of not being too proud or confident about yourself or your abilities. How do these look in daily life? A humble person can be confident without being big-headed or conceited and can respect others while maintaining their self-respect. A modest person is grateful for the talents they have and do not brag. Hand out the Write/Pair/Share Activity. Explain that students will have 8 minutes to answer the questions. At the end of 8 minutes, students will be paired with a partner, you will read your answers to your partner and they will read their responses to you.

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Write-Pair-Share

Remember, humility and selflessness is the ability to think of others before thinking about yourself. Modesty is the quality of not being too proud or confident about yourself or your abilities. You will have 8 minutes to answer the questions below. At the end of 8 minutes, you will be paired with a partner, you will read your answer to your partner and they will read their response to you. Write on the back if necessary. How do you show humility, selflessness and modesty?

a. Service to others-your neighbors, family members, friends. Give an example of a time when you
did something kind for someone else, expecting nothing in return
b. Admit when you are wrong or make mistakes and accept <u>constructive</u> criticism. Think of a time when you had to admit you were wrong or made a mistake. How did it make you feel?
c. Be a team player , receive compliments with modesty. How could you respond to someone who pays you a compliment?
d. Be thankful for talents you may have that allow you to excel in certain areas. What talents can you share with someone else?
e. No matter how much you think you know , there is always someone that knows more. Always be willing to learn something new. What is something you would like to learn more about?

Comprehension Questions Better Than You

- 1. Why does Tyler think Jake is a jerk? Tyler thinks his friend Jake is a jerk, because Jake always tries to show Tyler that he is better than him.
- 2. What did Jake do when Tyler showed him that he could finally do a layup? Jake shot a hook shot and said, I bet you can't do that.
- 3. Why did Tyler wish he was any place other than with Jake when he was talking to Sharise about his new Music Launch? When Jake started talking about his Tunage 300, he was telling them about all the things his music player could do that Jake's music player could not do.
- 4. What was Tyler's hardest subject in school? Tyler's hardest subject in school was math.
- 5. How did Tyler feel when he had to take a math test? Tyler got really nervous when he had to take a math test. His hands got sweaty and he felt like his brains turned to mush.
- 6. How would you have felt if you were in Tyler's shoes and someone like Jake was grading your paper? Answers will vary.
- 7. What did Tyler's Uncle Kevin mean when he told him the best way to get over the blues was to play them? Did playing the blues help Tyler feel better? Why or why not? Uncle Kevin was talking about playing the blues on the guitar. Playing the guitar did make Tyler feel better. Answers to the "why or why not" part of the question will vary but may include that it helped him get his mind on something other than Jake and the math test.
- 8. What did Tyler figure out about the way Jake treated all of his "friends" after talking to Uncle Kevin? Tyler figured out that Jake treated all of his "friends" the same way he treated Tyler. Jake always acted like he was better at everything than anyone else.
- 9. Why did Uncle Kevin say Jake was a lot like a pufferfish? Uncle Kevin said pufferfish blow themselves up to appear bigger in front of enemies, but when a kid does that, it pushes their friends away.
- 10. How is the friendship between Tyler and Niko different from the friendship between Tyler and Jake? The friendship between Tyler and Niko is one in which they hope to learn from one another, they compliment one another for things they do well, and they respect each other's strengths and weaknesses.
- 11. What is the central message of *Better Than You?* The central message is that it is better to be humble than it is to be conceited.


