
Emmanuel's Dream: The True Story of Emmanuel Ofosu Yeboah-Check for Understanding Questions

- 1. Where was Emmanuel born? Emmanuel was born in Ghana. West Africa.
- 2. Why did people say Emmanuel would be useless or a curse? People said Emmanuel would be useless or a curse because he only had one leg that worked.
- 3. Mama Comfort was a woman of faith; she named her son Emmanuel. What does the name Emmanuel mean? The name Emmanuel means "God is with us".
- 4. As Emmanuel grew up, his mother told him he could have anything, but what would he have to do? Emmanuel would have to get it for himself. And Emmanuel learned to work for things himself.


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The Flag of Ghana
