

Engage: Hook the students	 Explain: Pride is a feeling of happiness that comes from doing something good for someone else. Think/Pair/Share Activity-Pair the students with a partner. Explain the T/P/S directions. The students will think of their answer, get with their partner, and share their answer. T/P/S Question: How does it make you feel when you do something kind for someone else? Does it give you a sense of pride? Explain: When you do something kind for someone else, sometimes they will help you when you need help, that is what happens in the book you will listen to today. 		
Explore: Students make sense of a concept through observations.	 Play the YouTube Read Aloud <i>Tiny Lights</i>, Author-Brian Naylor, Illustrator Denise Mota. https://youtu.be/H3CgPqwOHx4?si=O5LSS3C1uVNmHl47 Read aloud the <i>Tiny Lights</i> Key Details Questions. Allow students time to complete the questions. Hand out Color Your Own Firefly Activity. Allow students time to complete the assignment. Hand out Make Your Own Firefly Activity. Allow students time to complete the assignment. Hand out Thank You cards. Students should write a brief note to a member of the school staff, thanking them for being a "Light" at your school. Allow students time to complete the assignment.

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Answer Key

Tiny Lights Key Details Questions

1. Who is the main character in the story *Tiny Lights*? Ollie is the main character in the story *Tiny Lights*.

2. What do you learn about the main character at the beginning of the story? At the beginning of the story, we learn that Ollie loves to play outside. We also learn that Ollie really loved animals and was always aware of any animals that might need his help.

3. What did Ollie find one morning on his way to school? Ollie found a little bug struggling to get out of the puddle of water.

4. What did Ollie do? Ollie got a stick and lifted the little bug out of the water.

5. What happened when the little bug tried to fly? When the little bug tried to fly, he could not fly because his wings were wet.

6. How did Ollie help the little bug? Ollie put the little bug inside of his pencil case for the day until his wings could dry out.

7. What did the little bug do when Ollie was taking notes at school? The little bug stood on Ollie's pencil when Ollie was taking notes, to see what Ollie was writing.

9. What did Ollie do when he got home from school? Ollie cleaned his room and did his homework, then he carried the tiny bug outside to let him go home before the storm.


10. Why was Ollie worried for the tiny bug after he let him go? Ollie was concerned for the tiny bug because a big thunderstorm rolled in.
