


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Answer Key Oral Check for Understanding Questions Courageous People Who Changed the World

- 1. William Wilberforce saw people from Africa being taken as slaves. What did he do to stop the slave trade? William talked to everyone who would listen to him how bad the slave ships were, and in 1807, Great Britain agreed the slave trade should end.
- 2. What did people call Harriet Tubman's secret path to freedom? People called Harriet Tubman's secret path to freedom the Underground Railroad.
- 3. Abraham Lincoln signed an important paper when he was President, what did the paper do? Abraham Lincoln signed a paper that said all of the slaves were free.
- 4. Why was Susan B. Anthony arrested? Susan B. Anthony was arrested when she tried to vote in an election.
- 5. When did women gain the right to vote in the United States? Women gained the right to vote in the United States in 1920.
- 6. How did Mahatma Gandhi like to work out problems? Gandhi did not believe in fighting to solve problems-he tried to work out problems peacefully.


