



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
If I Built a School Comprehension Questions

- 3. What is the difference between the word banned, and band? The word banned means that something has been excluded. The word band means a musical group or a group of people or a strap or ring.
- 4. What do you think about Jack's idea to fill the school with cute puppies and zoo animals? Answers will vary.
- 5. How would Jack build the classrooms? Jack would build the classrooms onto towers.


