A Short History of World War II

World War II was the most destructive war in human history. Millions of people died all over the world, either directly or indirectly as a result of the war. It lasted for about six years, from 1939 to 1945.

Who Fought in the War?

The war was fought between two main groups of countries:

- 1. The Allies: These countries included the United States (USA), the United Kingdom (Great Britain), the Soviet Union (Russia), and China, among many others. The Big Three were Great Britain, Russia and the United States.
- 2. The Axis Powers: The main Axis countries were Germany, Japan, and Italy.

Why Did the War Start?

The main reason the war started was because the leader of Germany, a man named Adolf Hitler, wanted to take control of many other countries in Europe. He had an army called the Nazis, and they believed that Germans were better than everyone else. In 1939, Germany invaded Poland, which started World War II. This caused Great Britain and France to declare war on Germany.

Important Battles and Events

- Pearl Harbor: In 1941, Japan launched a surprise attack on the U.S. Navy base at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. This is why the United States joined the war to fight the Axis Powers.
- D-Day: In 1944, thousands of Allied soldiers landed on the beaches of Normandy, France. This massive attack helped the Allies push the German army back out of France.
- The Holocaust: During the war, the Nazis carried out a terrible crime called the Holocaust.
 They murdered about six million Jewish people, because Hitler believed the Jews were responsible for the problems in Germany and millions of others they felt were inferior.

How Did the War End?

- In April 1945, Adolf Hitler died, and Germany surrendered a few days later, ending the war in Europe (called V-E Day).
- The war against Japan ended a few months later. The U.S. dropped two powerful new bombs (atomic bombs) on the Japanese cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. Japan surrendered shortly after, which is called V-J Day, in September 1945.
- The end of the war brought peace, but the world had to work hard to rebuild what was destroyed.
